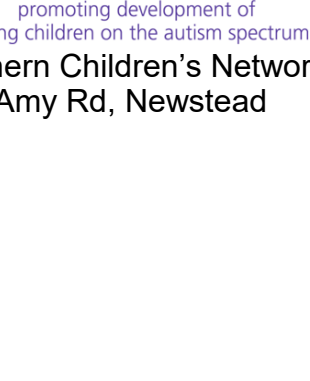

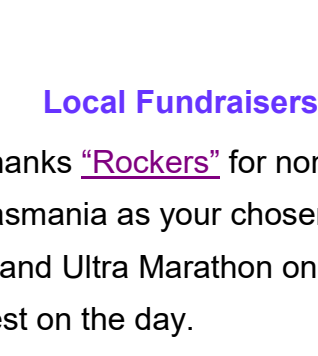

The conference theme is "Growing with Autism" and reflects the recent shift in autism research and practice to look beyond the early childhood and school years to the whole of life for people on the spectrum.

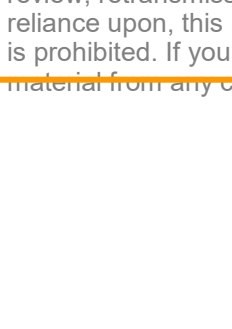

8. Business and NFP guide to selling or supplying to consumers with a disability

Businesses and not-for-profit organisations that sell to or supply consumers with disability, including participants of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), are bound by the same fair trading law that applies to all trade and commerce in Australia.

This law is called the Australian Consumer Law. It is important that businesses understand their rights and obligations at all times, when dealing with customers, wholesalers, suppliers and other businesses.
